



**THE DAOMA AND MURRAY STRASBERG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP
FOR GRADUATE STUDIES IN OCEAN ACOUSTICS**

Application Deadline: 13 March 2023

1. **THE SCHOLARSHIP AND ADMINISTRATION.** The scholarship is \$10,000 (awarded in two equal installments), up to an additional \$2,000 travel allowance to attend an ASA meeting during the term of the scholarship where preliminary results of the student's research would be presented. The term of the scholarship is 12 months, usually beginning with the fall academic semester. The recipient of the scholarship will be notified following the spring 2023 ASA meeting.
2. **ELIGIBILITY AND QUALIFICATIONS.** An applicant must be accepted to or enrolled in a doctoral degree program at a college or university in the United States (US) and pursuing research with relevance to naval applications in ocean acoustics or the related disciplines of physical or marine structural acoustics or the application of signal processing to these fields. Each applicant shall be a student member of ASA prior to applying for the scholarship (not simultaneously with the submission of the application for the scholarship).
3. **APPLICATION PROCEDURES.** The applicant is required to submit an application form that describes the planned course of study, and the proposed thesis topic (if available), and its relevance to naval applications. In addition, three letters of reference shall be provided – one letter must from the student's graduate advisor and one letter must be from a fellow or full member of ASA. The third letter need not be a member of the ASA. Reference letters must be on letterhead and signed by the letter writer. The completed application form, proof of acceptance to or enrollment in a graduate degree program at a US college or university, copies of transcripts of graduate and undergraduate study (official or unofficial), and a current curriculum vitae should be sent to asa@acousticalsociety.org in one complete pdf document. The three reference letters should be sent directly by the referees to asa@acousticalsociety.org.
4. **SELECTION COMMITTEE.** The scholarship selection committee will consist of five members each of whom will be selected by the Chairs of the following ASA technical committees - Acoustical Oceanography, Physical Acoustics, Structural Acoustics and Vibration, Signal Processing in Acoustics, and Underwater Acoustics.
5. **DEADLINES.** Applications for the 2023 scholarship shall be submitted no later than 13 March 2023 to the ASA office (asa@acousticalsociety.org). Applications received after that date will not be accepted. Reference letters submitted by the referees directly to the ASA office (asa@acousticalsociety.org) are also due by 13 March 2023.
